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Diagnosis And Treatment Of Feeding

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In children with developmental disabilities, diagnosis-specific treatment of feeding disorders results in significantly improved energy consumption and nutritional status. These data also indicate that decreased morbidity (reflected by a lower acute care hospitalization rate) may be related, at least in part, to successful management of feeding problems.

Objectives: Infantile feeding disorders (IFDs) are a common cause of food refusal, failure to thrive, and vomiting, but they may be difficult to diagnose. We have previously identified certain patterns of pathological feeding and behaviors as high-risk characteristics for IFDs and subsequently developed the diagnostic Wolfson criteria.

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DSM-5 Diagnostic Criteria. According to the DSM-5, a diagnosis of ARFID requires a disturbance in eating or feeding as evidenced by substantial weight loss (or, in children, absence of expected weight gain), nutritional deficiency, dependence on a feeding tube or dietary supplements, and/or significant psychosocial interference.

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However, many of the characteristic symptoms tend to resolve or become manageable over time with appropriate treatment. Others, particularly mental health issues, may develop and worsen over time—particularly those involving psychosis and schizophrenia. Early identification and intervention can greatly reduce the impact of these conditions.

Diagnosis is usually clinical, with a consistent history supported by dietetic assessment. Complementary diagnostic tests and subsequent management are guided by physical findings and severity of symptoms. Feeding disorders are usually subacute to chronic in nature.
