Remove any detachable parts. Manually wash, rinse, and sanitize detachable parts, or run them through the dishwashing machine. Avoid slip, trip, and fall injuries by establishing a cleaning program that:1. Takes into consideration peak hours, traffic patterns, and weather conditions2. Considers drying times when setting cleaning schedules3. Utilizes appropriate barricades to redirect pedestrians during cleaning.

Floor Cleaning Procedures For Slip, Trip, And Fall Prevention

Details regarding the correct cleaning system may be provided in a Safe Work Method Statement or other procedural guidance. Cleaning methods to consider. The cleaning method you use will depend on a number of factors. This is best decided in consultation with the flooring and cleaning equipment suppliers based on the workplace's requirements.

Never twist your back when holding or carrying a load use the following technique to turn. Lift the load using any of the previous techniques. postures and so that frequently Hold the load very close to your body at waist level. Turn the leading foot 90 degrees toward the direction you want to turn.

Safe Working Procedure (SWP) Manual Handling

All waste should be removed from the cleaning storage area. All chemicals and consumables should be used on a first in first out basis. Consumables could refer to anything that can be used up such as, toilet paper, soap disposable clothes etc. PPE should be clean and in perfect working order.

WHS Risk Management in the Cleaning Industry

Failure to appropriately manage hazardous manual tasks may result in a breach of WHS laws. General guidance is available in the model Code of Practice: How to Manage Work Health and Safety Risks and specific advice can be found in the model Code of Practice: Hazardous Manual Tasks and Identify, assess and control hazards .
