Not a typical Journal. Merton made these reflections on art, literature, religion, and Cuba while he was in his mid-20's living in New York, after he took an interest in Catholicism but before he became a Trappist monk. This was long before he became famous writer on Zen Buddhism, and like a lot of converts, Merton had his whole "convertitis" phase, when he took a superior attitude to the big "isms" of the 1930s (including atheism and Communism).
